Target Audience

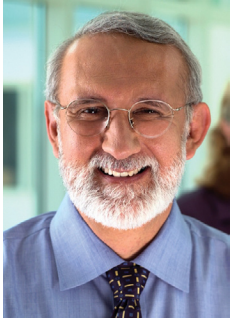
